Luke 4:17 - 21

Context

Baptised and anointed with the Holy Spirit – Luke 3:21

Jesus just entered public life – Luke 3:23

Full of the Holy Spirit – Luke 2:1

Tempted by the devil Luke 4:1 – 16

This is the first recorded words of Jesus in public

Luke 14:17-21

³⁵⁻³⁸ Then Jesus made a circuit of all the towns and villages. He taught in their meeting places, reported kingdom news, and healed their diseased bodies, healed their bruised and hurt lives. When he looked out over the crowds, his heart broke. So confused and aimless they were, like sheep with no shepherd.

Repeatedly reaches out to poor, women, Samaritans, lepers, children, prostitutes, tax collectors

Jesus and his disciples have a poor fund
