In 1912 Albania was declared an independent country



In 1913 half of the land and population of Albanian territory was divided between 4 other countries

Almost 50 years under Communist regime 1944 – 1991

In 1967 Albania was the first nation to adopt an atheist constitution.

5157 were executed

9052 died in prison

17.900 were imprisoned for political reasons
